Idea #1: Your New Favorite Song

Music is actually a great way to pray and grow closer to God. Lucky for us, there are SO MANY amazing Christian bands and singers out there. If you've never checked them out, you definitely should. And if you already have a few you like, now is a chance to find a new favorite!

- Research some Christian bands and singers
- Choose one band or singer and then choose one of their albums
- Listen to the whole album ... then choose one favorite song.
- Make a music review! Please include the band/singer name, the album, the song you choose, why you choose that band or singer and why that song was your favorite.
- You can write it like an article in a newspaper, make a video review, or be creative. HOW you do it doesn't matter nearly as much as how much effort you put into it.

Idea #2: God on the Radio?

- Prove that God is on the radio by finding a modern day pop, rock, country or other genre song that has a good Christian message but isn't actually called a Christian song.
- Print or write out the lyrics to that song.
- Convince us that this is "non-Christian" (otherwise known as secular) song actually has a great Christian message.
- You can write it out, make a video, create an art project, write a skit - anything that gets your message across and proves your point.

Idea #3: Soundtrack of Your Life - Faith Edition

- Your mission is to create a playlist of 4-5 Christian songs that you think best represent you and your faith journey.
- Things to consider: what mood or feelings best sum up your personality? Do the lyrics speak to you in some way? Does the feel or genre of the music represent you and your relationship with God?
- Make a list and include the title of the song, the artist, and why you choose that song (might be because of a particular line in the song, the name of the song, the way the music made you feel, anything!)
