

#### OFFERING "THE SIGN OF PEACE" DURING MASS

Beginning Sunday May  $1^{st}$ , the invitation to offer *The Sign of Peace* was resumed at all Masses at Mother of Divine Providence parish. By its nature the Eucharist is the sacrament of peace. At Mass, this dimension of the Eucharistic mystery is eloquently expressed during the Communion Rite when we offer each other the peace of the Risen Lord. When properly invoked and given to others in the celebration of Mass, this simple human gesture is lifted to the realm of the sacred.

In the United States, the Conference of Catholic Bishops has decided *The Sign of Peace* is reverently expressed by shaking hands only with those who are seated nearest to you, your immediate neighbors in the congregation. While the Sign of Peace is being given, it is acceptable to say; *The peace of the Lord be with you always*, to which the reply is *Amen*.

We recognize that shaking hands with those nearest you may be uncomfortable for some. In that case, a simple verbal exchange of peace may be offered.

Other expressions of Christ's peace, for example, waving to others seated at a distance from you or using the secular peace sign ("V") are gestures which are incompatible with the intended expression of communion with those nearest to you. Such gestures give rise to disorder in the congregation and should be avoided.

Offering the Sign of Peace at Mass remains an option which the priest may exercise at his discretion. Thank you for observing the proper us of this gesture during Mass.

## **UKRAINE IN CRISIS**

The Ukraine Greek Catholic Church (UGCC) in Kyiv is providing humanitarian aid and assistance to the community during this catastrophic time. 


