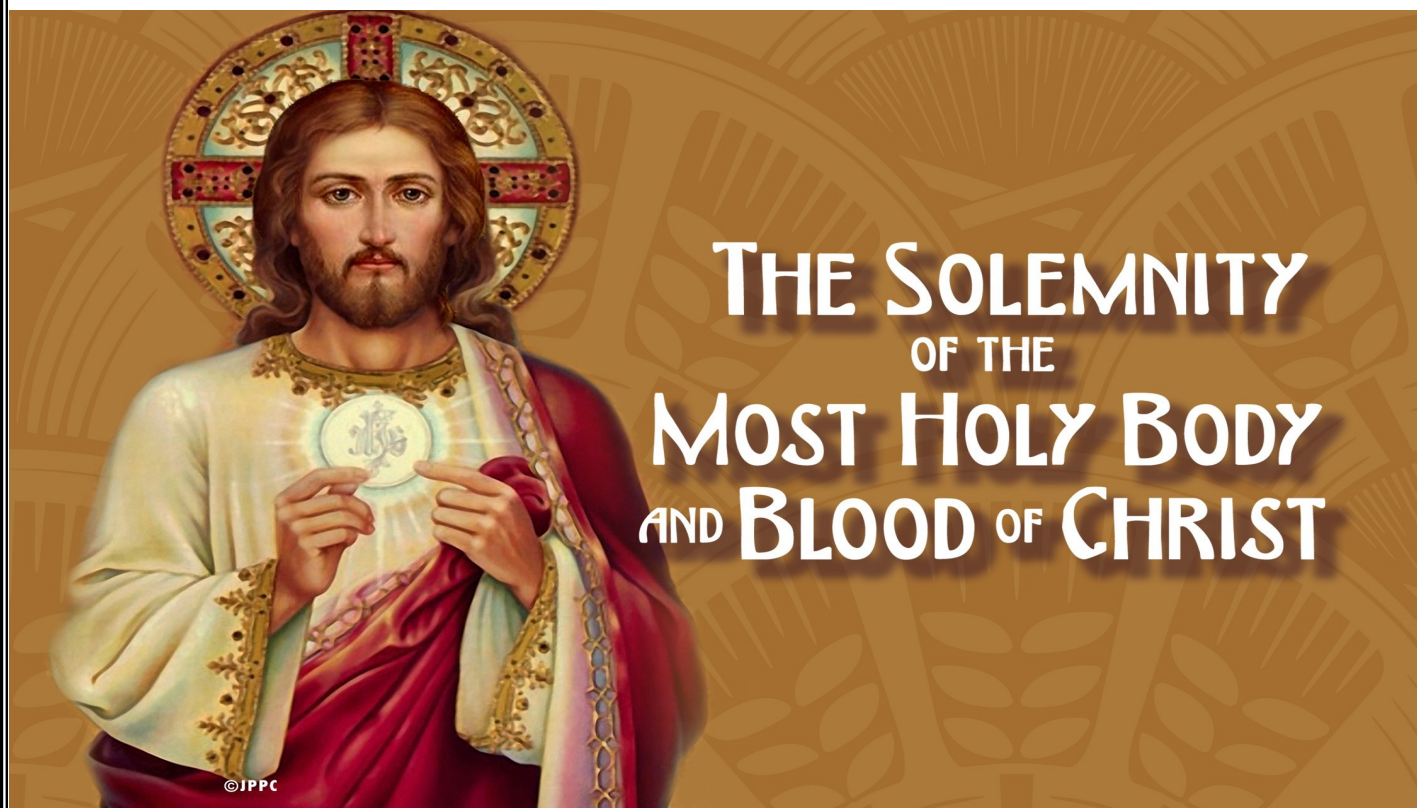

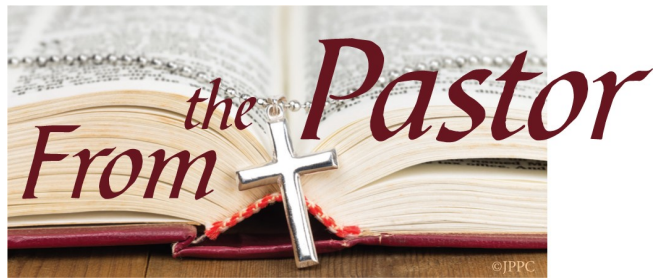

Dear Friends,

Today begins our yearlong Eucharistic Revival: a time of reclaiming what may have been lost in our faith, belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, confected on our Altar everyday for our salvation, and for the salvation of other longing souls.

From ancient times, wheat was ground into flour and baked into bread and grapes were crushed into juice and allowed to ferment into wine. Bread and wine became staples of the human diet, creating a simple meal that could be shared with others. Salem's king served them to a victorious Abram, pairing the bread and wine with a call of God's blessing upon His People.

At the Last Supper on Holy Thursday, Jesus blessed the bread and the wine, and shared it with His disciples as a sacramental sign of what would happen on Good Friday: Christ's sacrifice on the cross, thus establishing what we now recognize as the Holy Sacrifice of the Altar. It is in this Sacrifice that the priest changes the Bread and the Wine into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, which he then sacrifices to the Father for us and our salvation.

These Sacred Gifts, which look like bread and wine but are the real and living Body and Blood of Jesus, transforms us deep inside to satisfy our every hunger and our deepest thirst for the Bread of Life and the Cup of our Salvation.

O sacred banquet!

In which Christ is received,

the memory of His Passion is renewed,

the mind is filled with grace

and a pledge of future glory to us is given. Alleluia! – Saint Thomas Aquinas

Join us for the Solemn Procession around the outside of Church (after the 10:30 Mass) as a public witness of your faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

FROM OUR SEMINARIAN CHIKE

Last Sunday was the Solemnity of the Trinity focusing on relationship and this Sunday Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ This Solemnity that is a reminder of our life as participation in the relationship with Body and Blood of Christ. The participation points back to the relationship that the Lord is inviting us; the highest form of participation is in the celebration of Eucharist. There is no substitution to physical participation because in the celebration of the Eucharist Jesus is in His real presence.

A call to participate in the Body and Blood of Christ is our ultimate Catholic identity: we are part of Christ as Body and Blood. Hold this mental picture about the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. It is about Active participation in and with Jesus, a focus on the Real presence of Jesus. It is a Sacrifice and sacrament.

The Body and Blood of Christ is real: the miracle of Lanciano in Italy was tested, which after analysis by Dr. Edoardo Linoli the flesh is myocardium, which is heart muscular tissue, so we could say it is the heart of Jesus, the Sacred Heart. The Solemnity highlights the moment of greatest intimacy: the last thing He did and the last time He spent with His disciples and gave them the different mandate: do this in memory of Me. In the words of St. Augustine, whenever the priest holds up the Sacred Host: ‘See what you are and become what you see: the Body of Christ.’

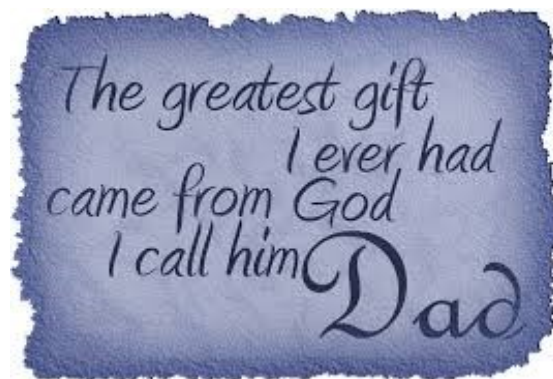
The Solemnity is our Catholic identity: We receive our identity and mission as a church in the celebration of the Eucharist because the Eucharist is the supreme form of Christ’s presence with us. At the end of the mass the priest says ‘Go in Peace to love and serve the Lord.’ Our call to love is the Christian identity of relationship as people who love and a mission as people who are every ready to serve in love. In line with the centrality, Jesus made us sharers in the life of God. As we receive Christ in the Eucharist, we are nourished with the heavenly food; we get elevated to a higher dignity as God’s children.

Every day we participate in this celebration, we replenish the nourishment: Pope Francis says “the Eucharist is not a

price for the good but strength for the weak the nourishment is in the sense of healing, sustenance and forgiveness.” In other words, we share in the divine life; we receive eternal life. We are elevated to divine sonship. Jesus’ style of showing love and His desire to be one with people, especially the broken and weak, was to share meals with them. From a cultural context, in the Jewish culture the sharing of a meal is a sign of acceptance and friendship.

Spend more time in Jesus and enjoying His real presence so that we are part of this sacrifice as we strengthen our faith so that we cease to look at Jesus with a mathematic eye but deeper gaze into the mystery of Christ in the Trinity.
