

My dear friends,

The Holy Spirit gathers us here today as we begin this forty-day season of Lent in the desert. The desert is a place where, amid its austerity and silence, the practice of fasting, almsgiving and prayer can wrench open our hearts and allow God to open our eyes and hearts to His Word and His ever-abiding presence in the Sacraments of the Church.

Temptation has been a part of the world since the beginning. In the story of creation, humanity's first home is the Garden of Eden, with the forbidden tree right in the center. We hear Adam and Eve succumb to the serpents' wiles in this garden of plenty.

MDP SHORE UP THE FUTURE

As of February 19, 2023, we have received \$200,070.50 in donations from 229 families for our 2020 Year 3 Challenge – renovations to the Parish Offices and creation of our Family and Youth Center. To date, we have spent \$172,745.40 on renovations including an enlarged office for the Director of Religious Education, several enlarged rooms for youth gatherings, new HVAC throughout both sides of the first floor of the building, upgraded electrical throughout the building, improvements to the front meeting room, and new carpeting and painting throughout much of the areas. FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ROTT

Reflection on the Temptation of Jesus.

In Matthew 4:1-11, we see how Jesus was "led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil and He fasted for forty days and forty nights" immediately after He began His public ministry. He was tempted by the evil one to do three things toward the end of this time:

- To turn stones into bread (lust of the flesh)
- Throw Himself down from the temple (get away from the temptation) and let the angles catch Him (pride of life)
- Worship the evil one and glory and riches could be had (lust of the eyes)

We can imagine that this preparation was very grueling for Jesus before He began His public ministry. This time of temptation would be an anchor for His ministry and ultimately for perseverance in His passion and death.

During lent, the Church doesn't want us just to fulfill an obligation, but invites us into a deeper communion with Christ. Sr. Mary Fidelis, PCPA once said "A big part of penance is that it frees us to be with Christ, to allow our passions and our appetites to be subdued by Christ so we can really be with Him and learn from Him and be like Him. Do it for love — do it for Christ. It doesn't have to be really huge things, but according to our strength and where we are in the spiritual life."

Let this Lenten season be a time for us to imitate Jesus, and in willingly making sacrifices, we will be better prepared to turn to the Lord when large, unexpected challenges come our way.

FAST & ABSTINENCE AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE FOR LENT

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, and on all the Fridays of Lent & Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

All are encouraged to participate in Operation Rice Bowl which has aided countless hungry persons here in the Archdiocese as well as throughout our nation and our world






