FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ROTT The Transfiguration

The Gospel accounts do not give us the location of the Transfiguration. Mount Tabor, standing at 1,886 feet tall, seems to be the most plausible location since this has been supported by the early church. A 3^{rd} century theologian named Origen (no pun intended) is the first person to put this location in writing. St. Jerome and St. Cyril of Jerusalem in the 4^{th} century confirm this location. In the 5^{th} century the Church started to recognize this site. In 1924 the current Transfiguration church was rebuilt over the remains of a 12^{th} century church.

Ten years ago I had the pleasure of visiting this shrine. Our bus barely made it up the hill and the road to take the bus up the hill was only one lane wide. No other motor vehicles could come in the opposite direction. People could also walk up 4,300 stairs built by church pilgrims in the 4th century.

We can imagine how grueling the trip up the mountain would have been for Jesus, Peter, James and John as there were no stairs, let alone vehicles. They would have been exhausted once they got to the top and saw Jesus conversing with Moses and Elijah. I am sure that they were scratching their heads as they went to the top of the mountain and thought why they had to make this journey up a rough terrain.

We can imagine after exhaustion, the disciples were able to see the Glory of God in a deeply mystical way, to the point where they were told not to say anything about this until the "Son of Man" has been raised from the dead.

In order for us to experience the joy of Easter, the Church asks us to voluntarily enter into the Lenten season with our acts of prayer, fasting and giving. Our worldly culture encourages us to look for the flattest road and take the path with the least resistance. Of course Jesus did not do this but discerned the perfect moment to lay down His life for each of us. Living out our faith in an unbelieving world is truly a journey as there will be very little consolation from the public. Climb the Lenten mountain well, but remember that the Lord has done all of the work. He just asks us to respond in faith.


