FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ROTT

Jesus answered and said to her (the woman at the well), "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

One of the great one-on-one interactions in the scripture is the interaction of Jesus with the woman at the well. The woman was a perfect example of an outsider due to circumstances that are beyond her control and due to sin in her life. All of us have a mixture of things that we bring to the Lord, both our background and our sins.

When Jesus encountered the woman, he was thirsty – both for water, but more importantly in the spiritual sense, thirsty for souls, for every one of us. He went outside of a normal person's comfort zone to encounter this woman. She is a reminder to us that God can save us no matter our circumstances, and that we do not need to overcome our sins in our own power before coming to Him. She is also a reminder to us that the Gospel is a universal call to holiness and Jesus is calling all to His fold, even our enemies.

We are at a midpoint during the Lenten season. Please keep in mind that one of the greatest things that can happen is that if we fail in our Lenten journey, we turn ourselves over to the Lord. In March of 2013, Pope Francis stated "God never tires of forgiving us, but we sometimes tire of asking Him to forgive us. Let us never tire of asking God's forgiveness. He is the loving Father who always forgives, who has that heart of mercy for all of us."

One of the best things that we can do during the Lenten season is to make ourselves available to a good confession. Please see our confession schedule in the bulletin as we have ample times to receive the sacrament of reconciliation.

Always keep in mind that we were created in Gods image and likeness, just like the woman at the well. Here are some reflection questions to help us deepen our relationship with Jesus:

- 1. To become more like our savior, how can I break biases in my own life so I can accept and learn from others different from me?
- 2. What are my deeper hungers and thirsts which only the Lord can satisfy?
- 3. Do I believe that Jesus accepts me as I am with my past failures and sins?
- 4. What is attractive about the way Jesus relates with the Samaritan woman?






