MDP SHORE UP THE FUTURE

As of March 13, 2023, we have received \$200,685.50 in donations from 229 families for our 2020 Year 3 Challenge – renovations to the Parish Offices and creation of our Family and Youth Center. To date, we have spent \$172,745.40 on renovations including an enlarged office for the Director of Religious Education, several enlarged rooms for youth gatherings, new HVAC throughout both sides of the first floor of the building, upgraded electrical throughout the building, improvements to the front meeting room, and new carpeting and painting throughout much of the areas. More renovations to the Family and Youth Center side are planned in the future. Thank you to all those who continue to contribute to this Appeal.



Dear Friends,

So often our world is plunged into the darkness of sin and evil. Jesus brings light to the darkness of the blind man's world, and He does the same for us. Only Jesus can lead you from darkness into the light. These are powerful realities that we face every day, so be assured of our prayers for you on this journey through the desert of Lent. Together, let us look forward to the oasis of Easter when all things will be new!

Parish Priorities for Missionary Discipleship

Last year, the Archbishop asked parishes to participate in a Disciple Maker Index Survey. We were then to put together a group of people to discuss the biggest themes, strengths and opportunities that emerged from the survey results. MDP called together the pastoral council and some others to participate in these discussions.

Here are the results of those conversations:

What were the biggest themes that emerged?

The themes that arose from our discussions were these: the evangelization of present and future parishioners; How we transition young adults and young families into our parish as community; and the way we instill the faith in all we welcome.

What are the strongest key drivers for your parish?

That Scripture is the Word of God; that the Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Christ, and that the community has available information at its disposal.

What are opportunities for growth in the parish?

Sharing personal stories; confidence in the Teachings of the Church and conversing about the story of Jesus.

What are potential strengths of your parish?

That we are a welcoming community that is safe and possesses a real reverence for God.

What are other potential opportunities for growth?

Openly expressing our faith with others, Catholic or not.

What else would you like to explore further?

Evangelization from the pews.

What kinds of support would you like to see from the Diocesan offices?

Availability for training and best practices discussion.

What is the most important insight you would like to share with your fellow parishioners in summary?

That we are a vibrant community that is becoming younger and more diverse and that we need to pass on what our heritage is as a welcoming, safe community who cares for each other.

Next week, I will publish our suggested activities to help equip our parish leaders to share their story of faith. I ask you as we continue to address these areas to actively participate in the on-going process. We need and would like to engage as many people as possible to help shape our parish as it grows in the love of God. We will have several activities under review at the same time and your assistance in contributing your time to one of those activities would be needed and appreciated.

Let us continue to pray for the fruitfulness of our Lenten practices as we eagerly prepare for the Festival of the Paschal Mystery, Father Cioppi

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ROTT St. Joseph, Our Spiritual Father

March 19th is traditionally the date the Church celebrates the Solemnity for St. Joseph. Since his feast falls on a Sunday during lent, the date will be recognized on Monday March 20th. The church has spent more time over the past 200 years understanding and expanding on the importance of his spiritual fatherhood than the past 1800 years. The need is even greater in our modern world as the role of strong fathers is very much needed. I recommend <u>Consecration to Saint</u> Joseph by Fr. Donald Calloway as a great resource to better understand the great patron of our church. The consecration can be started at 9 different times throughout the year; the next is March 30th which is 33 days before the Feast of St.

Joseph the Worker on May 1st. One of his most important roles was to be the protector of Jesus, especially during His infancy, as described in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. If he was the protector God made man during their earthly pilgrimages, imagine how much more we need his intercession!

Fr. Calloway does a great job of highlighting his role in the church and why he is important to us. I hope you enjoy this excerpt from the Consecration to St. Joseph.

- All fatherhood is a threat to Satan. For centuries the devil delighted in the reality that so few Christians prayed to Saint Joseph and called upon his paternal intercession. Today God wants to make Saint Joseph's fatherhood known and replicated in the world. This terrifies Satan. The devil knows what the intercession of Saint Joseph is capable of doing. If men resemble St. Joseph, the Kingdom of Satan will be destroyed.

- Satan hates motherhood too, of course, especially disdaining and fearing the Virgin Mary. Women are the bearers of life, and the devil hates life. Satan hates fatherhood because of the inherent power in all fatherhood. All fatherhood has its origin in God and finds his earthly model in Saint Joseph. All fatherhood has the power to combat evil. Lucifer fears the fatherhood of Saint Joseph more than any other creaturely fatherhood because the devil knows that there is no created person who has a greater participation in the fatherhood of God then in Saint Joseph.


- The devil is infuriated by the fact that God humbled himself to become a man and submitted himself to the 4th commandment. (Honor your mother and father).

- In taking on our human nature, the second person of the blessed Trinity chose a life of submitting to, obeying, and honoring mortals. The fact that the king of kings and the Lord of Lords obeyed the 4th commandment and submitted himself to the authority of Saint Joseph on earth is incomprehensible to Satan. God lowered himself to obey and serve creatures made from dust. The filial obedience of Jesus to Saint Joseph was met with the disdain of the devil.

- Saint Joseph's fatherhood has power. The devil hates that Jesus and Mary obeyed the loving directives of Saint Joseph. Now, in heaven, the intercessory power of Saint Joseph poses a serious threat to the wiles of the devil and the devil knows it.


