MDP SHORE UP THE FUTURE

As of March 27, 2023, we have received \$200,895.50 in donations from 229 families for our 2020 Year 3 Challenge – renovations to the Parish Offices and creation of our Family and Youth Center. FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ROTT

Palm Sunday

The Catechism of the Catholic Church does a great job of summarizing the account of Palm Sunday. In the catechism we read:

- How will Jerusalem welcome her Messiah? Although Jesus had always refused popular attempts to make Him king, He chooses the time and prepares the details for His messianic entry into the city of "his father David". Acclaimed as son of David, as the one who brings salvation (Hosanna means "Save!" or "Give salvation!"), the "King of glory" enters His City "riding on an ass". Jesus conquers the Daughter of Zion, a figure of His Church, neither by ruse nor by violence, but by the humility that bears witness to the truth. And so the subjects of His kingdom on that day are children and God's poor, who acclaim Him as had the angels when they announced Him to the shepherds. Their acclamation, "Blessed be He who comes in the name of the Lord", is taken up by the Church in the "Sanctus" of the Eucharistic liturgy that introduces the memorial of the Lord's Passover.

- Jesus' entry into Jerusalem manifested the coming of the kingdom that the King-Messiah was going to accomplish by the Passover of His Death and Resurrection. It is with the celebration of that entry on Palm Sunday that the Church's liturgy solemnly opens Holy Week. (CCC 559-560)

Use of Palm

The celebration of Palm Sunday dates to 4th century in Jerusalem, described in the travelogue "The Pilgrimage of Etheria". Christians at this time would remember the entry of Christ into Jerusalem using palms in a procession. The first recording of celebrating Palm Sunday within the context of our liturgy was from the 8th century Bobbio Sacramentary in Italy. In the Old Testament, the prophet Zechariah foretold that the messiah would come riding into Jerusalem on a humble donkey. This prophesy was fulfilled hundreds of years later as described in the gospels. John 12 tells us that those that followed Jesus met Him with palms as He processed into the city five days before the Passover. Palm branches were symbols of triumph and victory.

We know from the commemoration of Holy Week, the crowd will turn on Jesus as He celebrates the Last Supper and enters into His crucifixion. At Mother of Divine Providence, we are a part of the little crowd that will continue to follow Christ even to the point of His death and through our hardships. Have a grace filled Holy Week!

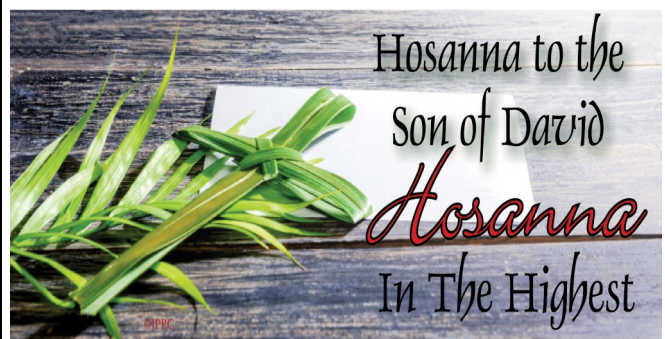
