MDP SHORE UP THE FUTURE

As of April 2, 2023, we have received \$201,050.50 in donations from 229 families for our 2020 Year 3 Challenge – renovations to the Parish Offices and creation of our Family and Youth Center. To date, we have spent \$172,745.40 on renovations including an enlarged office for the Director of Religious Education, several enlarged rooms for youth gatherings, new HVAC throughout both sides of the first floor of the building, upgraded electrical throughout the building, improvements to the front meeting room, and new carpeting and painting throughout much of the areas. More renovations to the Family and Youth Center side are planned in the future. Thank you to all those who continue to contribute to this Appeal.

IN OUR PARISH

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ROTT

The Doubting Thomas

St. Thomas was an apostle that was struggling with doubt – on a number of occasions. The gospel of John details his struggles:

- 1) In John 11, Thomas is concerned because Jesus wants to return back to Judea after hearing of the death of his friend Lazarus. After hearing about the desire of Our Lord to return to Judea, Thomas said “Let us also go to die with him.”
- 2) In John 14, Jesus said to His disciples that He was preparing a place for them in His Father’s house, Thomas said that he did not know where Jesus was going.”
- 3) The scene of Thomas doubting the risen Jesus in John 20.

Doubting can be caused by many different reasons. We can struggle with doubt because of past sins. We may have an intellectual understanding but having trouble giving our heart to our faith in Jesus. Also, we may struggle if we think that a plan that God may have for our lives or the lives of others may not happen the way that we expect. A convert to Catholicism from Atheism, Pat Flynn, points to the following thoughts on why our Catholic Faith has to be true:

- Philosophical arguments for God’s existence
- Cosmological evidence pointing toward a transcendent Creator
- Philosophical arguments for the existence of our trans physical soul
- Scientific evidence for the existence of our trans physical soul—i.e., near-death experiences and terminal lucidity
- Scientifically scrutinized Eucharistic miracles (Surely, Eucharistic miracles are an incredible confirmatory sign of an essential Catholic teaching: the Real Presence of

Christ in the Eucharist. They are—I submit—just the sort of thing we might expect God to give us if Catholicism is true, by way of occasional reminder.)

- Marian apparitions (including Fatima, though there are others), which testify to the core deposit of the Catholic faith, including the important role of our Blessed Mother
- The incredible endurance of the Catholic Church and her indefectibility. (Put simply, not only has the Catholic Church outlasted any other “merely human” institution, but she has remained firm in her essential teachings on faith, morals, and sacraments throughout her earthly existence—and, this is key—even in times of great corruption, which no sincere Catholic should deny. To me, such endurance and stability is only explicable in virtue of God providentially guiding His Church, even if individual members sometimes fall into moral depravity.)
- Biblical and historical support for Christ founding the Catholic Church, along with early belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist
- The fulfillment of Old Testament prophecies in Christ
- Historical evidence supporting the Resurrection of Christ (more detailed works here and there)
- Michelangelo, Mozart, waterfalls, and starry nights. There is objective beauty in the world. Make of that what you will.
- The failure of atheistic alternatives to adequately explain the relevant data of a contingent universe, human consciousness, objective morality, and evil.

Our Faith is meant to be tested at times, so that it can be strengthened. Like St. Thomas, we need to learn how to trust in the Lord and not let our doubt have the final word!

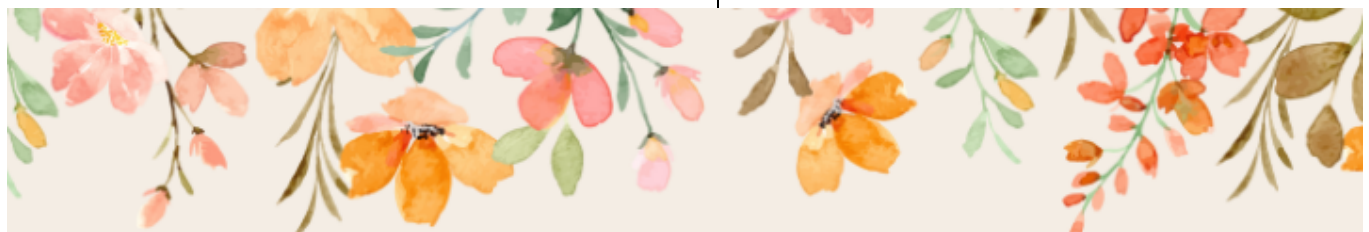
IS HIS NAME
